





Map 5 - Future Land Use









Community Open House Input- Comment Cards

1. First of all, thank you for surveying! Also, an off-leash dog park that is designated will help dog walkers but also people who don't want to meet dogwalking.
2. Consider multipurpose fields out at Ada Bible Church, create a Thornapple River canoe/kayak access point, Tassel Park for art, concerts, events, etc., something with a viewing area at the airport, a picnic area?
3. We live on the Thornapple River and we are still very concerned about the airport run off concerns. We are outdoor people- boating, biking, running, as well as dog runners. Please protect our nature in your planning.
4. Would love to explore mountain bike possibilities at Burton Park. West Michigan Mountain Bike Association builds and maintains trails for free. The trails are environmentally built using proper grades to avoid erosion. I would be happy to liaison with them if there is any possibility of bike trails in the park.
5. To actually have dogs on a leash would be wonderful.
6. Please put Dog Park in Burton Park using woods, have screening for dogs and a key card. Thanks.
7. Thanks for your effort. I want to help identify wildflowers, etc.
8. I'd like to encourage the Township to make more of the river accessible to the public. Specifically, I'd like to see Cascade buy up the waterfront properties on Thornapple River Drive near Cascade Road and turn that section of waterfront into public space. I'm visualizing something along the lines of the Reed's Lake waterfront from the EGR library to Rose's Restaurant.
9. AYSO would like to see a soccer complex in the area.


Survey Results

The community opinion survey was created using surveymonkey.com and was available for 5 weeks. Posters and fliers directing the community to the survey link were distributed to parents of children at local public schools and placed around the community. At the closing date of the survey, there were 169 responders.

- **35%** of respondents are between ages 45-54, **27%** are aged 35-44, **14%** are ages 65+.
- **80%** are homeowners in Cascade Township, **9%** live in Ada, **9%** live in another community.
- **64% live in Quadrant 2**, 12% live in Quadrant 1, 10% live in Quadrant 3.
- **71% of respondents** believe that parks, recreation, and open space are **Very Important** in Cascade Township. 28% believe that parks, trails, and open space are important.
- **63% of respondents** shared that their **whole family** were active users of parks, while 24% reported that they (themselves) were the most active users of parks.
- **Cascade Township Park is the most frequented park (15%)** followed by Burton Park (7%). Michael McGraw Park is the least visited park (61% never visit Michael McGraw Park). Respondents are most likely to visit Leslie E. Tassell Park a few times per year (55%).
- The most important benefit of parks in Cascade Township is to **provide opportunities to enjoy nature and the outdoors (88%)**, followed by improving health and wellness (70%) and protecting the natural environment and wildlife (70%).
- **58%** of respondents believe that **maintaining existing parks and facilities** is the most important factor in improving parks and recreation opportunities in Cascade Township. 19% believe that expanding the trail system is important.
- The main reason that respondents do not regularly use their local parks is because they are **too far away, or not conveniently located (20%)** or they use parks in other townships or cities (**20%**).
- Respondents believe that **trails with links to a regional trail system (Caledonia and Lowell)** should be the highest priority in developing pathways and trails (33%). 30% believe that developing unpaved nature trails should be a priority.
- **Top responses for where additional trails and pathways should be added or considered:**
 - 28th Street between Buttrick and Snow
 - Cascade Road
 - Riverwalk or boardwalk
 - Burton over I-96
 - Sidewalk along Thornapple River Dr. to Cascade Township Park
 - Near Quiggle Lake
 -
- Respondents believe that **natural areas (40%) are the most needed parks in Cascade Township**, followed by small neighborhood parks (34%), parks with water frontage (33%), and a sports complex park (27%) are most needed in Cascade Township.
- **Adolescents (10- 18)** are the most underserved by current offerings (40%), followed by children with disabilities (32%).

- **39% of respondents feel adequately served by area programming**, 35% responded that they felt somewhat adequately served, 27% responded that they did not feel adequately served by programming.
- **38% of respondents felt somewhat satisfied with the current recreational and parks offerings in Cascade Township**, 35% were satisfied, 15% were unsatisfied, and 11.5% were highly satisfied.
- **Trails and Paths (54%)**, an ice skating rink (31%), and a dog park (30%) were the top most desired amenities and facilities.
- **27% of respondents are willing to support a new parks millage at \$50.00 or less per year**, 23% are willing to spend between \$51.00- \$99.00 per year, 17% are uncertain, 17% are willing to spend between \$100.00 - \$199.00, 14% are not willing to support a new parks millage.
- **30% of respondents are willing to support the renewal of the pathways millage at \$50.00 or less per year**, 22% are uncertain, 19% are willing to spend between \$51.00 and \$99.00, 14% are willing to spend between \$100-\$199, and 13% are not willing to support a renewed pathways millage.


